

Team Building - Dragon Boat Racing

Dragon boat racing is one of Britain's most popular corporate team building events and for good reason, as it quickly gets everyone working together and having fun. It is not about individual skills, but everyone pulling together as one.

Exhilarating and fun, dragon boat racing is known for building better teams, improving communication, strengthening relationships and giving a real and lasting sense of achievement. Teams are given a safety briefing on land prior to going out on the water and our qualified and experienced helms coach and guide the teams on the best paddle and racing techniques.

For large numbers (40-500+), teams will compete in a series of heats for a half or full day, racing two to six boats at a time, with the fastest teams going through to the finals at the end of the day whilst for smaller numbers (18-40 people), participants will be on the water throughout and occupied with a variety of fun, team building exercises with races at the end and the sessions lasting up to two hours.
