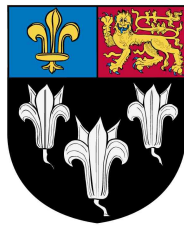

Wine List

White Wine Selection

- 1. Moreau Blanc, France** **£13.50**
Our ever popular French House white made by one of the best Chablis producing houses. Dry, fruity and very refreshing.
- 2. Viognier, Vin de Pays de d'Oc, France** **£14.00**
A grape that has only recently come back into favour, producing A superb dry wine which is an ideal accompaniment to fish.
- 3. Chenin Blanc, Eagles Cliff, S. Africa** **£14.25**
A grape which seems at its best grown in S. Africa, giving good acidity and producing a stunning crisp, dry wine.
- 4. Sauvignon Blanc, De Gras Chile** **£15.50**
Grown on the slopes of the Andes, this grape produces a characteristic dry, aromatic wine, with gooseberry and citrus overtones.
- 5. Pinot Grigio, Ca' Lungghetta, Italy** **£15.50**
A crisp and easy to drink wine with floral aromas. Great as a drinking wine or superb with fish and white meat.
- 6. Chardonnay, Yalumba, South Australia** **£17.00**
An un-oaked, soft Australian chardonnay with peach and melon flavours and a long, buttery finish.
- 7. Mâcon -Villages, Cave de l'Aurore, France** **£18.50**
Made with the chardonnay grape, this well balanced wine comes From the vineyards of Lugny. A delicate Favour of ripe tropical fruit and refined oak flavours.
- 8. Sauvignon Blanc, Moa Ridge, New Zealand** **£19.50**
From a small winery in Marlborough producing the primary fruit Character and crisp acidity that defines a really good Sauvignon.
- 9. Chablis, Domaine E. Dampt, France** **£22.50**
The classic Burgundy white. Greenish in colour, slightly flinty flavour with overtones of hay. Very crisp and deliciously dry. An extremely elegant and stylish wine. Recommended.
- 10. Sancerre, Domaine le Gemiere, France** **£23.50**
The King of Loire wines and probably the most distinctive of French wines. The aroma is almost gun-flint and the flavour slightly spicy and slightly smoky. Made with the Sauvignon grape it still has a superb crispness and acidity. A very well-balanced wine.

Rosé Wine Selection

- 11. La Lande Cinsault Rosé, France** £14.50
This wine has an attractive pale pink hue, and is fresh and light on the palate.
- 12. Pinot Grigio Rosé, Varsare, Italy** £15.50
A fine, light and crisp example of this Italian classic, great for Summer drinking.

Red Wine Selection

- 13. Moreau Rouge, France** £13.50
The sister to our house white and just as delicious.
- 14. Shiraz, Peter Lehmann, S.E. Australia** £14.00
A typical Aussie Shiraz, full of everything! Flavour, fruit bale, aromas. You name it – it's got it!
- 15. Merlot, De Gras, Chile** £14.50
From an award winning vineyard comes this terrific, full flavoured and superbly well rounded example of the Merlot grape. Exceptional value for money!
- 16. Tempranillo, Marquise de Riscal, Spain** £16.00
Bright Garnet in colour, stacked with red berry fruit, Soft in the mouth giving a smooth finish.
- 17. Chateau d'Angles, Coteau du Languedoc, France** £15.75
A Syrah/Grenache blend from the very south of France. and typical of the region. Full bodied, spicy, full of berry fruits and very drinkable.
- 18. Cote Du Rhone, Domaine de la Janasse,, France** £17.00
A deep crimson colour, full of rich spicy aromas without any harsh tannin aftertaste. This wine has a well rounded powerful palate.
- 19. Rioja Crianza, Marques de Caceres, Spain** £17.75
Created from a new style of making Rioja, this is blended from four different grapes to produce a food-friendly wine. It is full of flavour with that distinctive oaky tinge of all the finest Riojas.

20. Pinot Noir, Hamner Junction, New Zealand £18.50
A grape variety they specialise on in those parts! It gives a truly robust wine, full of ripe berry fruit character, all enhanced with a slight spicy oak flavour.

21. Cabernet Sauvignon, Gran Reserva, Chile £19.50
The grapes for this wine are handpicked from specific plots of low yield in the Loncomilla Valley and only the best go to make the wine. The result is an absolute stunner! The best we have tasted!

22. Fleurie, Louis Tete, France £21.00
An excellent Cru Beaujolais. Full fruit ripeness, plummy and rounded a classic expression of the Gamay grape.

23. Chateauneuf du Pape, St Dominique, France £25.00
Probably the finest of the Rhone Valley wines. Made mostly with the Grenache grape, it produces a rich ruby coloured, robust wine, tasting of ripe berries, with just a hint of spiciness.

Sparkling Wines & Champagne

House Champagne, Veuve Ricotteau £30.00
Excellent value for money from an independent producer. Presents a clean finish, is soft on the palate and compares well with some of the more famous Marques

Tattinger NV Brut, Reserva £40.00
A famous name which lives up to its reputation for excellent quality. Light straw colour with a clean, crisp finish.

Cava, Castelblanch Cristal Brut £16.00
A traditional method sparkling wine from the Penedes region of Spain. Dry with long lasting bubbles.
